

Volunteers needed for Yosemite High School's Challenge Day

Sixty adults are needed to volunteer for one or both days of Challenge Day to be held at Yosemite High School Feb. 28 and March 1, 2006.

A special program will be held for parents Thursday, Feb. 2, at 7 p.m. in the YHS library. Lusby will show the film, Surviving High School, to show parents what high school is like for teenagers today.
