

Falls sports put YHS in lead for Ginsburg Award

Yosemite High School once again is starting the school year off right. With the conclusion of the fall sports (excluding CIF football playoffs), the Badgers' athletic programs lead the North Sequoia League in points for the Erwin C. Ginsburg Award. The Ginsburg Award is presented to the school in the league which accumulates the most points in varsity sports throughout the school year.

"Yosemite got a big boost from girls cross country, gaining the maximum points available," said Yosemite Athletic Director Tom Fioronti. "I had to wait until the end of the cross country competition to figure out the standings."

For the varsity sports, points are derived from the schools position in the final standings in a given endeavor. A first place finish earns 24 points, 20 points for second, 18 points for third and so on. For the second year in a row, the girls cross country team earned 24 points as did the football team. The boys cross country team pulled in 16 points; the girls golf team 14 points, the volleyball and the girls tennis teams were awarded 10 points each.
