

**Yosemite High School
SIP Minutes
February 6, 2006**

1. Call to order: Betsy Blum called the meeting to order at 3:15 p.m.
2. Roll Call: Peggy Stewart, Valinda Clevenger, George Stillman, Becky Stolp, Betsy Blum, Gerard Klimbal, Steve Raupp, Rebecca Brokaw, student Nicole Krenz, student Rachel Tovar, and guest Earlene Ward (arrived at 4 p.m.)
3. Approval of January 9, 2006 Minutes and February 6, 2006 Agenda: George Stillman moved to approve the minutes and agenda and Becky Stolp seconded the motion. Vote carried unanimously.

Library and Audiovisual Funding Presentation – Betsy Blum

Betsy Blum reported on the 4 areas in which SIP aids in funding the library and school audiovisual needs. She reported in 4 key areas: Audiovisual supplies for classroom use, Library computers, the salary for the Library Technician, and History Day judging and travel to competitions. Betsy explained that California School libraries were flush with state money due to an entitlement made in 1998 to improve resources. Due to the decline in the state treasury, the money is now distributed through the SIP program at a fluctuating sum of approximately .50 cents per ADA. The SIP monies, which support the library, are in agreement with the YUHSD adopted School Library Plan.

Proposal Request – Approval for distribution to staff

The deadline to file is Friday, March 3rd, 2006. Betsy explained that the document is even more user friendly now as it is available and can even be filled out on-line. Rebecca Brokaw moved to approve the proposal request as amended and Becky Stolp seconded the motion. Vote carried unanimously.

Budget Update

Betsy explained that the expenditures since the last meeting include funding the choir trip to Salt Lake City, Utah, and VHS/DVD players for staff.

Approval of Consolidated Application – Presentation by Earlene Ward

Earlene Ward and Steve Raupp gave an excellent summary of the contents of the Consolidated Application for Funding Categorical Aid Programs (Part II.) Within the application there is an abundance of data. Topics covered include Title I, Title II, Title IV, Title V, PAR, EIA, School Safety and Violence Prevention, NCLB Teacher Requirements, and the School Level Free and Reduced Price Meals Program Report

Steve Raupp explained the importance of the WASC self-study visitation and that the student and parent members of SIP would be requested to meet with the WASC visiting committee on two dates March 26th and March 27th.
